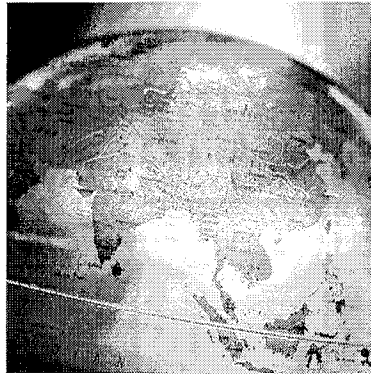

Remember: Your JOURNEY for the JAMBOREE at Camporee is in tents; EVERYTHING you need for the weekend must be carried into camp on your back.

Webelos TEAM Members

YOUNG LADS you must put the following items in your Duffel bag (Back Pack) and carry it into camp with you.

1. Whistle
2. Flashlight
3. Compass
4. Change of Clothing
5. Water (1 Quart)

6. Mess Kit
7. Webelos Book
8. Rain Gear
9. Personal First Aid Kit
10. Currency (Money)

Note: For Webelos who have recently crossed over into Boy Scouting. If the leader feels this expedition needs extra leadership, you may request a "GUIDE" (Troop Guide). This is a member of the TRAIL GUIDES. However we must know prior to the JAMBOREE EXPEDITION (Camporee). General Camporee Information

Location:

The WORLD JAMBOREE is being held at COYOTE KNOLLS CAMPGROUNDS, Lake Berryessa, Napa, CA.

Arrival:

Upon arrival each member will unload at the FRONT GATE and BACK into the parking SPACE AS DIRECTED. The PATROL will PACK ALL GEAR IN ON THEIR BACKS (JR. PATROL WILL BE ALLOWED VEHICLES FOR GEAR , BUT MUST HIKE IN). PATROL Flags, UNIFORMS AND PACKS will be judged at this time, the PATROL LEADERS and the ADULT LEADERS will register their groups AT THE TRAVEL AGENCY. When the group has completed PACK, FLAG and UNIFORM inspections they will go to THE LOADING DOCKS FOR GAMES. When the ADULT LEADER is finished WITH his paperwork he may GATHER HIS PATROL & begin set-up IN THE ASSIGNED AREAS.

Check In:

THE PATROL should check in as a PATROL, with all of its members present. You may check in as early as 5:30 P.M., but no later than 8:30 P.M. From this time on, the Patrol Leader will be in charge of the PATROL.

Please try to car pool so that you can have as few cars as possible.

Campsites:

Each Team will receive their campsite assignment at the TRAVEL AGENCY. You will camp as a Patrol, but in a designated camp site. The Patrol will function under the direction of their SR. Patrol Leader (SPL). Patrol LEADERS will be camping with their Patrols. Water is available at the Bathrooms. Patrols need to bring containers for the transporting and storage

of water. ALL Patrol MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED TO CARRY WATER WITH THEM AT ALL TIMES DURING THIS WEEKEND. VIOLATORS WILL BE SENT TO THE TRAVEL AGENTS OFFICE.

DISHWASHING AND THE CLEANING OF POTS AND PANS WILL BE DONE AT YOUR TEAM'S CAMPSITE!!

NO DISHWASHING AT FAUCETS OR IN THE BATHE ROOM

Garbage:

Bring your own garbage bags! You must take all of your garbage with you when you leave camp!! There are no garbage cans available! Bag and take with you all of your own garbage or FACE A PUBLIC FLOGGING. We will have bags for recycling. Please make sure that all bottles and cans are put in recycling bags.

Leave No Trace

Fires:

No fires are permitted in campsite fire pits (ONLY STOVES PER GTSS). Report any wildfires to the TRAVEL AGENCY.

Stoves:

You are expected to bring and use your own stoves. They shall be used in accordance with BSA Safety guidelines. Fuels will be stored at the TRAVEL AGENCY.

First Aid:

First Aid is available at the TRAVEL AGENCY. NOTE: Permission slips and medical records will be collected AND REMAIN WITH THE DOC. They are very important, should you require a trip to the CLINIC.

Warning: there is a lot of poison oak, TICKS, AND MINI BEARS In the WORLD. Please be very careful when walking on trails and in your campsites. CHECK FOR TICKS FREQUENTLY. Please stay in designated areas only.

WORLDLY MANNERS:

We are Scouts. This is a scout event. Proper LANGUAGE is expected. Class A Uniform is required for Friday night, Saturday assembly, Campfire, Sunday assembly and Scouts Own. Class B uniform is appropriate for the rest of your WORLD TRAVELS.

Items of Clothing with any "Message" other than Scouting are not permitted!!

Conduct:

Every Patrol MEMBER is expected to conduct himself in a "Scout Like" manner, living up to the Scout Oath and Law. Adhere to the Outdoor code, staying within the boundaries of camp and on designated roads and trails. Keep bathrooms clean. Put trash in bags and take it home with you! Respect other Patrols and be quiet after Taps. Inappropriate conduct will result in the Patrol and his Adult Leader being referred to the UN Leader, RESULTING IN Tariffs for appropriate action and a loss of points to the Patrol.

Campfire:

Friday night's CELEBRATION will be held at the World Jamboree stage and will include entertainment by the WORLDLY PLAYERS. Saturday Night's celebration will also be held at the World Jamboree stage and will include skits and songs put on by some of the patrols. Class "A" uniform and a flashlight are appropriate for the CELEBRATION.

Visitors:

The CAMP is open to visitors. Family and friends are invited to attend and observe your patrols in action! Visitors attending are asked to bring their own food. Unfortunately, non-boy scouts are not permitted to stay overnight.

Patrol Site Inspections:

Patrol camp sites will be inspected periodically during the journey. patrol equipment, organization, commissary and food, safety, and campsite cleanliness will be scored.

International Trading Post:

The International Trading Post will be open for business on Saturday with some treats. The STORE hours will be posted at the TRAVEL AGENCY. DOC'S OFFICE (FIRST AID) WILL BE LOCATED THERE ALSO.

Check Out:

If your patrol must leave early, please notify the TRAVEL AGENCY in advance. The last page of this guide book is an Evaluation Form. When you are ready to check out, the patrol LEADER will bring this form to the TRAVEL AGENCY. Your campsite WILL BE inspected for cleanliness. If your campsite is clean and neat, The INSPECTOR will sign the form so that you may receive your patches and depart.

TRAVEL AGENTS are here to BE SAFETY supervisors and observe. Adult Leaders and visitors are not permitted to coach PARTICIPANTS on any event or they will lose points. The patrol LEADER should lead the patrols during the EVENTS. Any patrol member not conforming to oath & law, may be asked to leave for safety reasons.

Swim Classification Procedures

The swim classification of individuals participating in a Boy Scouts of America activity is a key element in both Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat. The swim classification tests should be renewed annually, preferably at the beginning of each outdoor season. Traditionally, the swim classification test has only been conducted at a long term summer camp. However, there is no restriction that this be the only place the test is conducted. It may be more useful to conduct the swim classification prior to a unit going to summer camp.

All persons participating in BSA aquatics are classified according to swimming ability. The classification tests and test procedures have been developed and structured to demonstrate a skill level consistent with the circumstances in which the individual will be in the water. The Swimmer's Test demonstrates the minimum level of swimming ability for recreational and instructional activity in a confined body of water with a maximum 12 foot depth and with shallow water footing or a pool or pier edge always within 25 feet of the swimmer.

The various components of each test evaluate the several skills essential to the minimum level of swimming ability. Each step of the test is important and should be followed as listed below:

SWIMMER'S TEST:

Jump feet first into water over the head in depth, level off₁ and begin swimming. Swim 75 yards in a strong manner using one or more of the following strokes: side stroke, breast stroke, trudgen, or crawl; then swim 25 yards using an easy resting back stroke. The 100 yards must be swum continuously and include at least one sharp turn. After completing the swim, rest by floating.

BEGINNER'S TEST:

Jump feet first into water over the head in depth, level off, swim 25 feet on the surface, stop, turn sharply, resume swimming as before, and return to starting place.

ADMINISTRATION OF SWIM CLASSIFICATION TEST (THE COUNCIL CHOOSES ONE OF THESE OPTIONS):

OPTION A (at camp):

The swim classification test is completed the first day of camp by Camp Aquatics personnel.

OPTION B (Council conducted / council controlled):

The council controls the swim classification process by predetermined dates, locations and approved personnel to serve as aquatics instructors. When the unit goes to a summer camp, each individual will be issued a buddy tag under the direction of the Camp Aquatics Director for use at the camp.

OPTION C (At unit level with council-approved aquatics resource people):

The swim classification test done at a unit level should be conducted by one of the following council-approved resource people: Aquatics Instructor, BSA; Aquatics Supervisor; BSA Lifeguard; certified lifeguard; swimming instructor; or swim coach. When the unit goes to a summer camp, each individual will be issued a buddy tag under the direction of the Camp Aquatics Director for use at the camp.

SPECIAL NOTE:

When swim tests are conducted away from camp or at the point of activity, the Aquatics Director shall at all times reserve the authority to review or retest all participants to ensure that standards have been maintained.
